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ORDER

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 30.03.2024 for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 3(2)(a), 4(2) (c), 4 (1), 5(1) (d) of Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act in **crime No. 214 of 2024** on the file of the respondent, seeks bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner was approached the defacto complainant and took him to Aishu spa where he showed the two women who were used as a sex workers. Thereafter, he lodged a complaint about the said spa before the respondent police.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case. On the other side, the learned Government Advocate (Crl. side) submits that petitioner was approached the defacto complainant and took him to Aishu spa where he showed the two women who were used as a sex workers. Further, he stated that said womens were secured. However, he raised objection to grant bail.

4. Considering the period of incarceration undergone by the



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petitioner and also the investigation is almost completed. Hence, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only)** with **two sureties (one must be a blood surety)**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the **learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Tiruppur**, and on further conditions that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police on alternative days at 10.30 a.m., until further orders. Further, the petitioner is directed to deposit a sum of **Rs.20,000/- (Twenty Thousand Only)** to the credit of **Society for the Educational and Economic Development (SEED) Reg., Sriperumbudur.** Account Name : SEED

**period of two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during
investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence
or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions,
the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take
appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance
with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the
petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial
Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court
in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW
5560]**;

[f] If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR
can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
