



Crl.O.P.No.12047 of 2024

The Petitioner/Accused in Crime No.1 of 2024 registered by the respondent police for the offences under Sections 376, 406 & 420 IPC, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The learned counsel for the Petitioner stated that the Petitioner is an innocent person and has not committed any offence as alleged. He has been falsely implicated in this case. Thus, he prays for grant of anticipatory bail to the Petitioner herein.

3. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) stated that as per the FIR, the Petitioner and the defacto complainant got married on 21.02.2024. Thereafter, the Petitioner had received a sum of Rs.10,00,000/- from the defacto complainant through Gpay and Credit Card. It is further stated that the Petitioner attempted to marry another girl and when it was questioned, the defacto complainant was abused by the Petitioner. Thus, he prayed for dismissal of this petition.



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4. Having regard to the allegations made in the FIR and the other circumstances, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the Petitioner subject to the following conditions. Accordingly, the Petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the **learned District Munsif cum Judicial Magistrate, Pallavaram**, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further conditions that :

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders.



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[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
