3.In the instant case, the order was passed by the 1st respondent on 04.10.2017. The Writ Petition has been filed before this Court on 05.07.2024.The only reason that has been assigned in the affidavit filed in support of the writ petition is as follows:

“15.It is also further submitted that I had approached a counsel named Adithya reddy to prefer a writ before the Hon'ble High Court of Madras. I submit that I was put into shock when I came to know the fact that the Adithya Reddy never filed any writ before the High Court of Madras and cheated me these all years along. I submit that later they produced some of the documents that I produced.”

4.The above allegation made against some Advocate is completely vague bereft of any details. The petitioner does not even say as to when the petitioner approached the Advocate and what follow up action was taken. Therefore, by making some vague allegations, the petitioner cannot get over the exorbitant delay of 7 years in approaching this Court. This writ petition is hit by latches and accordingly the same is hereby dismissed. Consequently, the connected Miscellaneous Petition is closed.
