2.This Civil Miscellaneous petition has been filed seeking to condone the delay of 166 days in filing the Civil Miscellaneous Appeal.

4.Having satisfied with the reasons assigned in the affidavit filed in support of this petition, the miscellaneous petition is allowed and the delay of 166 days is condoned.
