ORDER

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody
on 05.08.2024, for the alleged offence punishable under Section 3 of Tamil



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Nadu Public Property (Prevention of Damage & Loss) Act, 1992 in Crime No.398 of 2024, on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that on 05.08.2024, at about 9.00 a.m., the petitioner came to the medical shop of the defacto complainant, where he is working as a labourer, damaged the properties in the medical shop, worth about Rs.50,000/-. Hence the complaint.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has been falsely implicated in this case, since he has got some previous cases. He has not committed any offence as alleged in the FIR. He would further submit that the petitioner was arrested and is in judicial custody for more than 35 days and is ready to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he prayed bail for the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent police submitted that the ancestral property of the petitioner was purchased by the defacto complainant, due to this, on the date of the alleged



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occurrence, the petitioner came to the medical shop of the defacto complainant, where he is working as a labourer and also damaged the medical properties, worth about Rs.50,000/-. He further submitted that the petitioner has five previous cases, pending against him. Hence, he opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. Heard both sides and perused the materials available on record including the First Information Report.

6. Considering the nature of offence, and considering that there is a property dispute between the petitioner and the defacto complainant and also considering the period of incarceration undergone by the petitioner, and also considering that though the petitioner has five previous cases, in all other cases, he has been released on bail, and also considering all others factors, I am inclined to grant bail to the petitioner, subject to certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Judicial



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Magistrate No.I, Arakkonam, and on further conditions that:-

[a] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police, everyday at 10.30 a.m., for a period of 30 days and thereafter as and when required for interrogation.

[b] the petitioner shall not commit any offences of similar nature.

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].



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[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 BNS.
