The petitioner who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 457 & 511 of IPC in Crime No.117 of 2024, on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution as per the defacto complainant is that, petitioner along with other accused trespassed into the defacto complainant's company and attempted to steal the copper wire worth about Rs.2,00,000/-. Hence, the case.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that, petitioner is an innocent person and he has been falsely implicated in this case. He further submit that, co-accused were arrested and released on bail and also submit that petitioner is ready to abide by any stringent condition that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

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4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent police would submit that, petitioner along with other accused trespassed into the defacto complainant's company and attempted to steal copper wires worth about Rs.2,00,000/-. Hence, he opposed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner, the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent police and perused the materials available on record including the FIR.

6. Taking note of the facts and circumstances of the case, the submissions made by the learned counsel on either side, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before **the learned Judicial Magistrate, Palacode**, on condition that the petitioner shall

execute a separate bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each** for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police everyday at 10.30.a.m. for a period of two weeks and thereafter, every Saturday at 10.30.a.m. until further orders.

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions,

the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
