### **ORDER**

Apprehending arrest in connection with Crime No.54 of 2024, registered for the offences punishable under Sections 85, 137(2), 145, 49 & 351(3) of BNS, the present petition has been filed seeking anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the accused had harassed and demanded dowry.

Further allegation is that the mother-in-law had compelled the defacto complainant

to have sexual intercourse. Hence, the case.



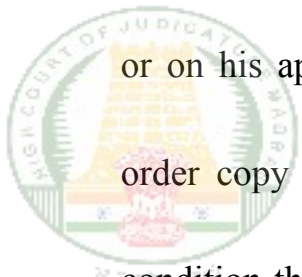
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3. Pleading innocence on the part of the petitioner, false implication in the case, learned counsel for the petitioner seeks indulgence of this court. He would submit that due to matrimonial dispute a false complaint has been given. He would submit that he is no way connected with the above said offences. He would further submit that he is ready to abide by any stringent conditions that may be imposed by this Court.

4. The case of the prosecution as put forth by the learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police, opposing for grant of anticipatory bail, is that the accused had harassed and demanded dowry. Further allegation is that the mother-in-law had compelled the defacto complainant to have sexual intercourse.

5. Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) for the respondent Police and perused the materials available on record, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest



or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which

order copy made ready, before the learned Judicial Magistrate I, Udumalpet, on

condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.15,000/- (Rupees

Fifteen Thousand only) each with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction

of the respondent police or the police officer who intend to arrest or to the

satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for

anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of his Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police on every Saturday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

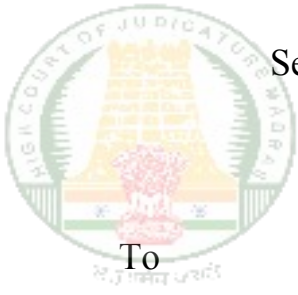
[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs.

State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560];

[f] If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under
