Apprehending arrest in connection with Crime No.287 of 2024 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 191(2), 296(b), 118(1), 126(1) and 351(2) of BNS, 2023, r/w. Section 4 of TNWH, the present petition has been filed seeking anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to previous enmity with regard to property dispute, the petitioner along with other accused assaulted the defacto complainant. Hence the case.

3. Pleading innocence on the part of the petitioner, false implication in the case, learned counsel for the petitioner seeks indulgence of this court. He would further submit that the petitioner is ready to abide by any stringent condition that may be imposed by this Court.

4. The case of the prosecution as putforth by the learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police, is that, due to property dispute, on 12.11.2024, the petitioner along with other accused assaulted the defacto complainant and caused grievous injury. He would submit

that the injured after four weeks discharged from the hospital. He would further

submit that the petitioner has one previous case of similar nature.

5. Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner, the learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) for the respondent Police and perused the materials available on record, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the learned **District Munsif Cum Judicial Magistrate, Kurinjipadi**, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand Only)** with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of his Aadhar card or Bank pass Book

to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall stay at Chengalpattu and report before the Inspector of Police, Chengalpattu Police Station, everyday at 10.30 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter, report before the respondent police on every Saturday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**;

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
