PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.66 of 2024 on the file of the respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police in connection with Crime No.66 of 2024 for the offence under Sections 294(b), 342, 323, 353 and 506(1) of IPC, have filed this petition seeking anticipatory bail.

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2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioners along with others raised noise, quarrelled with each other and caused nuisance to the public. The defacto complainant warned the petitioners, due to which, the petitioners abused the defacto complainant in filthy language and attacked him. Hence, the case.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners did not commit any offence as alleged by the prosecution and they have been falsely implicated in this case.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Crl. side) has strongly objected for grant of anticipatory bail on the ground that the investigation is yet to be completed. He fairly conceded that the injured person has sustained simple injury and no previous case is pending against the petitioners.

5.Considering the nature of allegations and the victim sustained simple injury and also considering the antecedent of the petitioners, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

6.Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate Court No.VI, Trichy, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand) each



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with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, and on further conditions that:

(i) The petitioners and the sureties shall submit a copy of their Aadhaar Card or any other identity card issued by the government in proof of their residence address;

(ii) The petitioners shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 am until further orders. They have to co-operate for the investigation.

(iii) The petitioners shall not misuse the liberty granted to them by indulging in any further offence and shall not tamper with the prosecution witnesses.

(iv) On violation of any of the above conditions by the petitioners, the respondent police shall move an application for cancellation of the anticipatory bail.
