PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Section 438 of Cr.P.C.

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.110 of 2024 on the file of the Respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/ A2, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police
for the offences punishable under Sections 294(b), 307 and 109 IPC, in Crime No.110



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of 2024, on the file of the respondent Police, seeks anticipatory bail.

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2. The case of the prosecution is that due to the civil dispute, the petitioner herein along with other accused said to have abused the defacto complainant in filthy language and also attacked him. Hence the case.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent and a false case has been foisted against him. He further submit that the injured is discharged from the hospital. Hence, he prays to grant bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the State would submit that the petitioner herein along with other accused at the instigation of second accused the first accused said to have abused the defacto complainant in filthy language and also attacked him. Hence, he objected to grant bail to the petitioner. However he fairly concedes that the injured is discharged from the hospital and there is no previous case pending against the petitioner.

5. Taking into consideration the facts and circumstances of the case and also the facts that the injured is discharged from the hospital and no previous case is pending against the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.



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6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned District Munsif cum Judicial Magistrate, Alangudi, Pudukkottai District, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall stay at Virudhunagar District and she shall report before the Inspector of Police, Virudhunagar Town Police Station, Virudhunagar, daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of 15 days and thereafter, she shall report before the respondent Police as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with



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law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner is released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[f]If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
