PRAYER :-

For Bail in Cr No.496 of 2023 on the file of the respondent Police.



ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

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The petitioners, who were arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 10.12.2023 for the offence punishable under Sections 294(b), 307, 506(ii) IPC in Cr.No.496 of 2023 on the file of the respondent police, seek bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that there was a dispute between the parties with regard to the temple, in which, the accused persons abused the defacto complainant in filthy language and also attacked him with aruval. Hence, the case.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners are innocents and they have been falsely implicated in this case. He would further submit that the petitioners are in judicial custody from 10.12.2023, hence they may be released on bail.

4.The learned Additional Public Prosecutor would submit that the investigation in this case has been completed and charge sheet also filed, which was taken on file in S.C.No.254 of 2024 by the trial Court.

5.Considering facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the period of incarceration, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners on



6 Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail, on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.V, Tirunelveli, Tirunelveli District.

[i] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Special Court/concerned Court may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.

[ii] The petitioners shall report before the concerned trial Court for all hearing dates without fail;

[iii] the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness;

[iv] the petitioners shall not abscond during trial.

[v] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].



[vii] If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
