PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.483 of B.N.S.S.

PRAYER :-

For Bail in Crime no.53 of 2024 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/A11, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on

25.07.2024 for the offences punishable under Sections 147, 148, 341, 427, 307, 109, 120

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(B), 212 of IPC, 25(1A) of Arms Act and 3, 4(a), 4(b) of Explosive Substances Act, in Crime No.53 of 2024 on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that due to previous enmity, the accused persons are said to have waylaid the defacto complainant, who was coming in a car and threw country bombs and made gun shot against him. Hence, the complaint.

3.Heard both sides.

4.Considering the fact that the petitioner being a lady and aged about 52 years and considering the argument of the learned counsel for the petitioner that her son was earlier done to death by the defacto complainant and therefore, she was implicated and also considering the fact that the petitioner is in jail from 25.07.2024, I am inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail with certain conditions.

5.Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail, on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thirumangalam.

(i)the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate/concerned court may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity;

(ii)the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m.,

for a period of three weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation;

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(iii) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness;

iv) the petitioner shall not abscond during trial.

v) On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

vi) If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
