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ORDER

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This Criminal Original Petition has been filed seeking orders to call for the records pertaining to the First Information Report in Crime No.143 of 2024 on the file of the first respondent police and quash the same as illegal against the petitioner.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the defacto complainant is a divorcee, that the petitioner and the defacto complainant lived together, that the defacto complainant gave her jewels and credit card to the petitioner, through which, the petitioner bought bike, car etc., and that thereafter, there arose a difference of opinion between them and when the defacto complainant asked to return the amount, the petitioner abused her in filthy language and also threatened her stating that he will upload and send obscene photos to her relatives and hence, the defacto complainant has lodged a complaint.

3.When the matter is taken up for hearing today, the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the second respondent has lodged a complaint before the first respondent and on that basis, FIR came to be registered in Crime No.143 of 2024 for the



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offences under Sections 420, 506(i) IPC and Section 67 of the Information Technology Act against the petitioner.

4.The case is still under the investigation. By passage of time, the parties have decided to bury their hatchet and compromise the dispute amicably among themselves.

5.A Joint Memo of Compromise has been filed before this Court which have been signed by the petitioners and the second respondent and also by their respective counsel. The petitioners and the second respondent were also present in person before this Court and they were identified by Mr.S.Sethuramakrishnan, Special Sub Inspector, Aruppukottai Town Police Station as well as by the learned counsels appearing for the parties. This Court also enquired both the parties and was satisfied that the parties have come to an amicable settlement between themselves.

6.In the instant case, the dispute is of personal in nature and now the parties had compromised. Where the parties have compromised the matter, the High Court has power to quash the complaint for the offences under Sections 420, 506(i) IPC and Section 67 of the Information Technology Act.



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7.The legal position expressed by the Hon'ble Apex Court in the case of ***Gian Singh vs. State of Panjab and another*** reported in ***(2012)10 SCC 303*** and ***Parbathbhai Aahir @ Parbathbhai Vs. State of Gujraath*** reported in ***(2017)9 SCC 641*** were taken into consideration.

8.In the light of the guidelines issued in the above said Judgments of the Hon'ble Apex Court, no useful purpose will be served in keeping the proceedings in Crime No.143 of 2024 pending before the first respondent police, even though, the offences involved are not compoundable in nature.

9.Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition stands allowed and as a sequel, the proceedings in Crime No.143 of 2024 on the file of the first respondent police, is quashed and the terms of joint compromise memo shall form part and parcel of this order.
