PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL UNDER SECTION 482 OF BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No. 519 of 2024 on the file of the Respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner / Accused No.1, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 296(b), 115(2), 351(2)

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BNS and Section 4 of Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act in Crime No.519 of 2024, on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that on 19.09.2024, at about 12.30 P.M., due to wordy quarrel arose between the petitioner and the defacto complainant, the petitioner along with other accused persons herein abused the defacto complainant by using filthy language and also attacked him. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case. He would further submit that the petitioner has no previous case.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent Police would submit that due to wordy quarrel arose between the parties, the petitioner herein attacked the defacto complainant with hands and caused simple injury to him. He would further submit that no previous case is pending against this petitioner.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and considering the fact that the victim sustained simple injury, this Court is inclined to enlarge the petitioner on anticipatory bail with certain conditions:

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which



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the order copy made ready, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Madurai District, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of one week and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in

P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

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[f] If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
