PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.483 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Bail in Crime No.476 of 2024 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/Sole Accused, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody
on 23.09.2024 for the offences under Sections 296(b) and 351(3) of BNS Act and



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Section 25(1-A) of Arms Act, 1959, in Crime No.476 of 2024, on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner and other accused were found in illegal possession of sword in the public place.

3.Heard. Perused the materials available on record including the First Information Report.

4.Considering the nature of allegations against the petitioner that the petitioner along with the other accused wielded weapon in the public place and were found to be threatening the public when the police party arrived at the scene and considering the fact that the petitioner was arrested on 23.09.2024, I am inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail, subject to the following conditions:

[a] Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on condition to execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned District Munsif cum Judicial Magistrate Court, Thiruvudaimaruthur, Thanjavur District, and on further conditions that:

[b] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.



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[c] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. for a period two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.

[d] the petitioner shall not commit any offences of similar nature.

[e] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[f] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[g] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[h] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
