PRAYER :-

For Bail in Crime No. 737 of 2024 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/A1, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on

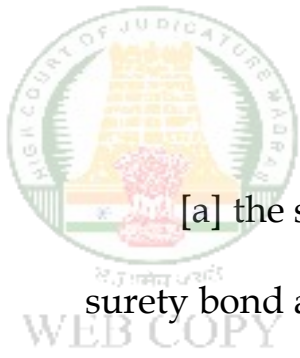
2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner (A2) and another accused person with deadly weapons threatened the general public and were demanding money.

3. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the respondent police submitted that there are totally three previous cases against the petitioner and that the petitioner is a history-sheeter.

4. Per contra, the learned Counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that a false case has been foisted against the petitioner and the petitioner has suffered incarceration from 12.10.2024 onwards.

5. Taking into consideration the facts and circumstances of the case and the materials placed before this Court and also considering the fact that this petitioner has already suffered incarceration from 12.10.2024 onwards, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner subject to the following conditions.

6. Accordingly, the criminal original petition is ordered and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruvidadaimaruthur, and on further conditions that:-



[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police every Monday and Friday at 05.30 p.m until further orders except on the days when the case is posted for hearing before the trial Court.

[c] the petitioner shall appear before the trial Court during every hearing date without fail.

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[e] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[f] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].



[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
