Petition under Section 438 of Cr.P.C praying that in the circumstances stated in the Memorandum of Grounds of Criminal Petition, the High Court may be pleased to grant Anticipatory Bail to the petitioner by directing the police to release him on bail in the event of his arrest in connection with Unregistered Crime of 2024 of Hayathnagar Police Station in the interests of justice

This Petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the Memorandum of Grounds of Criminal Petition and upon hearing the arguments of Sri M TARAK ABHILASH, Advocate for the Petitioner and the Public Prosecutor (TG) on behalf of the Respondent No.1 and none appeared for the Respondent No. 2

The Court made the following: ORDER

THE HONOURABLE SRI JUSTICE K.SURENDER

CRIMINAL PETITION No.832 OF 2024

O R D E R:

1. This Criminal Petition is filed under Section 438 of Cr.P.C. by the petitioner - accused seeking anticipatory bail in the event of his arrest in connection with unregistered crime on the file of Hayathnagar Police Station.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Additional Public Prosecutor for respondent No.1 - State and perused the record.
3. The petitioner, who is the husband of respondent No.2 – wife addressed a legal notice on 06.12.2022 asking her to join his company, failing which he would proceed against her legally. The apprehension now is that the wife of the petitioner may file a false complaint and he may be booked for the offence under Section 498-A of IPC and allied sections.
4. In the said circumstances, in the event of registering a crime against the petitioner and if the offences registered against the petitioner are punishable upto seven years, the Investigating Officer concerned is directed to follow the

procedure laid down under Section 41-A Cr.P.C and also the guidelines formulated by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Arnesh Kumar v. State of Bihar**¹ scrupulously. The petitioner shall co-operate with the Investigating Officer and shall attend before the Investigating Officer as and when directed for the purpose of investigation by furnishing information and documents as sought in concluding the investigation.

5. Accordingly, the Criminal Petition is disposed off. Miscellaneous applications pending, if any, shall stand closed.

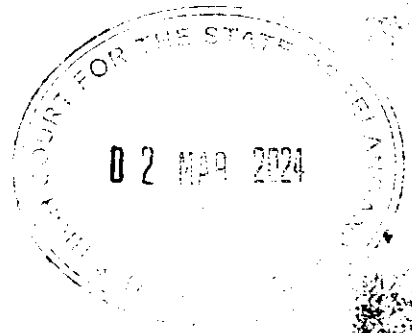
