CONTEMPT CASE No. 1620 of 2019

ORDER:

This Contempt Case is filed invoking the provisions under Sections 10 to 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act to punish the respondent for gross violation of the orders passed by this Court in W.P.No.3941 of 2017, dated 19.06.2019.

2. Heard Smt Pushpa Rani, learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Assistant Government Pleader for Revenue appearing on behalf of the respondent.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that inspite of the specific direction issued by this Court on 19.06.2019, respondent has not considered the claim of the petitioner for issuance of pattadar pass books, without any valid reasons.

4. Learned Assistant Government Pleader submits that pursuant to the order of this Court dated 19.06.2019, respondent considered the application submitted by the petitioner dated 30.08.2019 and issued proceedings vide Rc.No.B/2106/2019, dated 16.12.2019, rejecting the claim of the petitioner and placed a copy of the said proceedings by duly serving upon the learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. In view of the compliance of the order passed by this Court on 19.06.2019, no further adjudication is required.

6. Accordingly, the Contempt Case is closed. However, the petitioner is granted liberty to avail the remedies as available under law including questioning the proceedings dated 16.12.2019. No costs.

Pending miscellaneous petitions, if any, shall stand closed.

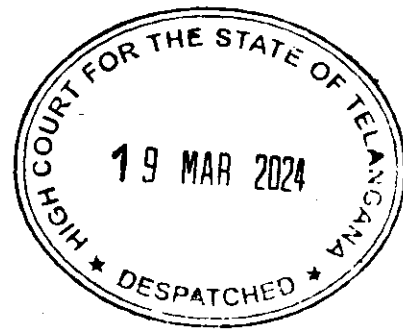
