

THE HONOURABLE SMT. JUSTICE K. SUJANA

CRIMINAL PETITION No.13305 of 2024

ORDER:

Seeking the Court to enlarge the petitioners who are arrayed as accused Nos.1 and 2 in Crime No.123 of 2024 of Hayathnagar Prohibition and Excise Police Station, Ranga Reddy District, on bail, the present Criminal Petition is filed.

2. The brief facts of the case are that on 29.09.2024, the Excise Police seized the contraband as the accused persons are buying and selling the contraband illegally to the general public in order to earn money in an ease manner and also registered a case vide Crime No.123 of 2024 before the Hayathnagar Prohibition and Excise Police, Medchal Malkajgiri District, for the offences punishable under Sections 8(c) read with 20(b)(ii)(B) of NDPS Act.

3. Heard Sri Krishnaiah Cheedarla, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners as well as Sri Syed Yasar Manoon, learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing on behalf of the respondent-State.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioners *firstly* submitted that the seized contraband is just Intermediate Quantity. He

secondly submitted that all the material witnesses were examined, and further detention of the petitioners is unnecessary. He *thirdly* submitted that the petitioners have been in judicial custody since 29.09.2024, causing undue hardship to their families. The allegations are false and fabricated. The petitioners are residents of Malkangri District, Odisha State, with movable and immovable properties, and are willing to furnish sureties as directed. He *lastly* submitted that previously, bail application of the petitioners, *vide* CrI.M.P.No.678 of 2024, was dismissed by the I Additional Metropolitan Sessions Judge, Ranga Reddy District at L.B.Nagar, on 19.10.2024, without valid reasons. Therefore, he prayed the Court to grant bail to the petitioners by allowing this criminal petition.

5. On the other hand, learned Additional Public Prosecutor opposed the submissions made by the learned counsel for the petitioners stating that the investigation is not yet completed, therefore, granting bail to them, at this stage, does not arise. Hence, he prayed the Court to dismiss the criminal petition.

6. After considering submissions from both the parties and reviewing the record, since the seized contraband is Intermediate Quantity and material part of investigation is

completed, this Court deems it fit to grant bail to the petitioners subject to the following conditions:

- i. The petitioners shall execute a personal bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) each, with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the XIII Additional Metropolitan Sessions Judge, Cyberabad, Ranga Reddy District at L.B.Nagar.
- ii. The petitioners shall appear before the concerned SHO at 11:00 a.m., on every Monday for a period of eight (8) weeks, for the purpose of investigation, and thereafter, as and when required.
- iii. The petitioners shall abide by the conditions stipulated in Section 437(3) of Cr.P.C.(presently, Section 480(3) of the BNSS).

7. Accordingly, the Criminal petition is allowed.

Miscellaneous applications, if any pending, shall stand closed.
