DEEPAK GUPTA, J. (ORAL)

[1] On 04.01.2024, the following order was passed by this Court:-

“ Present: Mr. Munish Behl, Advocate for the petitioner.

Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C in case FIR No.19 dated 12.01.2023 registered under Section 18 of Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 registered at Police Station Parao Ambala Cantt, District Ambala.

As per allegations 3 kgs. of opium from co-accused Nandan Sahni; and 500 gms. of opium from another co-accused Randhir Kumar was recovered on 12.01.2023. It is alleged that on the basis of disclosure statement of co-accused Nandan Sahni, petitioner was nominated to be involved in crime.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioner has never been involved in any such case; that he has clean antecedents; that petitioner is ready to join the investigation and that he is being implicated on the basis of disclosure statement of co-accused, which is not admissible.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Parveen Kumar Aggarwal, DAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of respondent- State.

Adjourned to 12.02.2024.

In the meantime, in case of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. However, it is directed that the petitioner

shall join the investigation as and when so required by the Investigating Officer. He shall not contact any person associated with the case to dissuade him from the investigation in any manner whatsoever and nor shall leave the country without prior permission of the Court. He shall further comply with the conditions stipulated in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. ”

[2] Today, learned State Counsel, has informed this Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation, in compliance of the order dated 04.01.2024 and is no longer required for further investigation.

[3] In view of the aforesaid, the order dated 04.01.2024, whereby the petitioner was granted interim anticipatory bail, is hereby made absolute. However, he shall continue to join investigation, if and so required by the Investigating Officer.
