Status report by way of affidavit of Shri Gurcharan Singh,
Deputy Superintendent of Police, State Special Operation Cell, SAS
Nagar, on behalf of respondent-State along with the custody certificate
has been filed.

2. By way of present petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C.,
petitioner prays for grant of regular bail in a case arising out of FIR
No.0015 dated 04.09.2023, under Section 25(8) of the Arms Act, 1959,
registered at Police Station State Special Operations Cell, SAS Nagar,
Mohali, District Intelligence Wing (CID).

3. As per the prosecution allegations, on 04.09.2023 on the
basis of secret information, petitioner was apprehended along with co-
accused Manjit Singh. The secret information was to the effect that they
were bringing illegal weapons. One pistol each were recovered from
petitioner and the co-accused.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioner
has been falsely implicated; that he is not involved in any such case; that

he is in custody for the last more than 04 months and that the case is triable by the Magistrate, so he be allowed bail.

5. Custody certificate produced by learned State counsel would reveal that petitioner is in custody for the last 04 months and 26 days, though he is involved in one more case, pertaining to Excise Act. Learned State counsel also concedes that the case in question is triable by the Magistrate; that investigation is complete and the trial may take time to conclude.

6. Having regard to the aforesaid facts and circumstances, but without commenting anything on the merits of the case, petitioner is admitted to bail. He is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing requisite bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned Trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned, on usual terms and conditions.
