JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to the respondents to release disability pension and other retiral benefits.
2. Mr. Ashok Bhardwaj, Advocate, at the outset submits that he confines his prayer before this Court qua disability pension.
3. The respondent, as admitted in the reply, has already sanctioned disability pension and referred the matter to DPDO, Kapurthala, however, the said authority is not crediting disability pension in the account of the petitioner.
4. Faced with this, Mr. Somesh Gupta, learned counsel for the respondents submits that the petitioner is not submitting his documents with DPDO, thus, the said authority is unable to process claim of the petitioner.

5. From the record as well arguments of both sides, it comes out that there is no dispute regarding eligibility of the petitioner qua disability pension, however, the matter is hinging because of miscommunication on the part of both sides.
6. To resolve the issue, the petitioner is directed to appear before DPDO, Kapurthala on **04.03.2024 (Monday)** at **10:00 AM** along with requisite documents. Before the said date, the respondent would complete formalities which are necessary on their part. The petitioner is at liberty to avail his remedies with respect to other claims.
7. Disposed of in above terms.
8. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
