Present petition has been filed under Section 482 of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, *inter alia*, for issuance of appropriate directions to official respondents not to conduct multiple inquiries on the same subject matter.

In pursuance of notice of motion issued by the then Co-ordinate Bench, short reply by way of affidavit dated 24.11.2024 of Mr. Ajay Raj Singh, PPS, Superintendent of Police, (Investigation) Tarn Taran, on behalf of respondents No. 1 to 3 has been filed and the same is taken on record. Copy supplied to the other side.

For reference, para No. 3 of the above affidavit is extracted here under:-

“That the present petition become infructuous as all the complaints made by the respondent No.5 were thoroughly



investigated and the respondent No.5 was also joined in enquiry and his statement was also recorded. Based on the facts and figures no imputations were proved as the enquiry was done in free and fair manner and accordingly the complaints already stand filed in the office.”

3. In view of the aforesaid stand taken by respondents No.1 to 3, learned counsel for the petitioner, on instructions, submits that present petition be disposed off as having been rendered infructuous “at this stage”.
