By way of present petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C., petitioner prays for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.271 dated 08.12.2023 registered under Section 15 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 (for short, 'the NDPS Act') at Police Station Guruharsahai, District Feorzepur.

As per allegations, on the basis of some secret information received by the Police, raid was conducted at the house of the petitioner. Petitioner was noticed coming out of his house carrying a bag over his head. On looking the vehicle of the police party, petitioner fled away from the spot throwing the bag on the ground. On search of the bag, 32 kg of poppy husk was found.

It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner has been falsely implicated; that it is not possible for the petitioner to run away from the spot in the presence of the large number of police officials.

Notice of motion.

Ms. Kanica Sachdeva, AAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent- State.

Learned State Counsel rightly points out that the petitioner had run away at the sight of the vehicle of the police party and so, he could not be apprehended by the Police. It is also informed by learned State Counsel that petitioner is also involved in two more cases pertaining to the NDPS Act.

In view of the above, I do not find the present case to be a fit case for grant of anticipatory bail.

Dismissed.
