JASJIT SINGH BEDI, J.

The prayer in the present petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for the grant of regular bail in case bearing FIR No.67 dated 24.08.2023 registered under Sections 379-A, 342 and 120-B read with Section 34 of the IPC, later on Section 379-B IPC was added at Police Station Rohdai, District Rewari, Haryana.

2. The present FIR came to be registered at the instance of Birbal son of Umesh Mehta who stated that he along with his partner were in the business of Bee keeping. While he was sleeping, 4-5 persons came, tied him with ropes on the cot, snatched his mobile phone and stole 40 Bee boxes. The persons were calling each other by the names Mony and Ritik.

Pursuant to the registration of the FIR, one Rashid alias Chotu was arrested on 08.09.2023 and in his disclosure statement, he named the

present petitioner. The petitioner was arrested and got recovered the mobile phone of the complainant and 29 boxes of honey bee.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case. The occurrence took place on 24.08.2023 at about 1.00 AM/1.30 AM whereas the FIR was registered on 24.08.2023 at about 2.47 PM. The delay in the registration of the FIR was fatal to the prosecution case. The recovery had been planted upon the petitioner. As he was in custody since 11.09.2023, the investigation stood completed but none of the 18 prosecution witnesses had been examined so far, he was entitled to the concession of bail moreso when in the one other case registered against him arising out of FIR No.159/2023 dated 01.09.2023 under Section 380 IPC, Police Station Jathlana, Yamuna Nagar, he had been granted the concession of bail.

4. On the other hand, the learned State counsel contends that the nature of the allegations levelled against the petitioner and his co-accused did not entitle him to the concession of bail. He, however, concedes that the petitioner was in custody since 11.09.2023, none of the 18 prosecution witnesses had been examined so far and that in the one other case registered against the petitioner, he had been granted the concession of bail.

5. I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

6. The veracity of the prosecution case against the petitioner and his co-accused shall be adjudicated upon during the course of the Trial. Admittedly, the petitioner is in custody since 11.09.2023, none of the 18 prosecution witnesses has been examined so far. Therefore, the Trial of the

present case is not likely to be concluded anytime soon. In this situation, the further incarceration of the petitioner is not required.

7. Thus without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner-Rafi son of Talib Singh is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned CJM/Duty Magistrate, concerned.

8. The petitioner shall appear before the police station concerned on the first Monday of every month till the conclusion of the Trial and inform in writing each time that he is not involved in any other crime other than the cases mentioned in this order.

9. If the petitioner or his family members/associates make any attempt to contact/threaten/intimidate the witnesses in the present case, the State would be at liberty to move an application for cancellation of bail granted vide this order.

10. In addition, the petitioner (or anyone on his behalf) shall prepare an FDR in the sum of Rs.50,000/- and deposit the same with the Trial Court. The same would be liable to be forfeited as per law in case of the absence of the petitioner from the trial without sufficient cause.

8. The petition stands disposed of.
