SURESHWAR THAKUR, J. (ORAL)

1. Reply to the petition has been filed by State, which is taken on record.

2. The learned State counsel, on instructions imparted to him by the officer concerned, submits, that though the period of parole granted to the present petitioner is to end on 16.1.2024. However, he submits, that the present petitioner suffered an accident on 30.11.2023, and, the said accident has led to his leg being operated upon. He further submits, that as a sequel to the operation done upon the present petitioner, he has become bed ridden. Therefore, though the instant petition seeking extension of the parole period from 16.1.2024, till another eight weeks, is rather not maintainable before this Court, as the jurisdiction to grant extension, is solitarily vested in the competent authority concerned.

3. Nonetheless, in the face of the above distressing medical condition besetting the present petitioner, whereby he has become deterred to re-step into the prison concerned, on 16.1.2024, thus this Court proceeds to, but not as a precedent, extend the parole period for another

three weeks.

4. Accordingly, the parole already granted to the present petitioner is extended for three weeks i.e. w.e.f. 16.1.2024 to 6.2.2024. The present petitioner is directed to, on 6.2.2024, re-step into the prison concerned. In case, he does not do so, the jurisdictional SHO concerned, shall proceed to draw warrants of arrest against the petitioner, and, shall proceed to ensure that thereafter the present petitioner is ensured to become retrieved in the prison concerned. The other conditions relating to the present petitioner becoming granted parole shall remain undisturbed.

5. The petition stands disposed of.
