HARPREET KAUR JEEWAN, J. (ORAL)

[1] The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.316 dated 19.10.2023, registered at Police Station Sadar Mansa, District Mansa, under Sections 354-A, 324, 323, 452 and 506 of the IPC along with all the subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise deed dated 22.10.2023 (Annexure P-2) executed between the parties.

[2] Learned counsel for the petitioner *inter alia* contends that the FIR was got registered by respondent No.2 on the allegations that the petitioner misbehaved with respondent No. 2 and also inflicted injuries. The matter stands resolved now. The parties are residents of same village. They want to live in peace and want to compromise the matter. There is no grievous injury on any vital part of the body.

[3] Learned counsel appearing on behalf of respondent Nos. 2 and 3 has confirmed the factum of compromise between the parties and submits that they do not want to take any action in the present FIR.

[4] On 08.02.2024, the parties were directed to appear before the

trial Court/Illaq Magistrate for recording of their statements regarding the compromise.

[5] As per the report dated 14.03.2024, received from the learned Addl. Chief Judicial Magistrate, Mansa, the compromise effected between the parties is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence. The petitioner has not been declared as "Proclaimed Offender".

[6] Learned State counsel has not raised any objection regarding the acceptance of the present petition.

[7] Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the case, the fact that the compromise between the parties is genuine and voluntarily made and in view of the ratio of the decision of Hon'ble Apex Court in Gian Singh Versus State of Punjab (SC) 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and the decision of Hon'ble the Full Bench of this Court in Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and others 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the ends of justice would meet if the FIR and consequential proceedings are quashed by accepting the compromise between the parties.

[8] Consequently, this petition is allowed and FIR No. 316 dated 19.10.2023, registered at Police Station Sadar Mansa, District Mansa, under Sections 354-A, 324, 323, 452 and 506 of the IPC and all the subsequent proceedings emanating therefrom are ordered to be quashed, qua the petitioner.

[9] Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
