1. On 12.01.2024, the following order was passed by this

Court:-

“Through the instant petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C., prayer is made for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.252 dated 16.12.2023 under Sections 420, 120-B of IPC and under Section 13 of the Punjab Travel Professional (Regulation) Act, 2014, registered at Police Station Mukerian, District Hoshiarpur.

The prosecution agency was set into motion on a secret information, that the present petitioner is running an office under the name of Preet Enterprises and there are many complaints against the petitioner that he is cheating the innocent people on the pretext of sending them abroad.

It is informed that the present petitioner alongwith his partner Sudesh Masih, had opened a office under the name of GULF Job Point, without any licence and also circulated the pamphlet for sending the people to Kuwait for a sum of ₹ 35,000/-per candidate. On the basis of the secret information, the instant FIR was registered, raid was conducted and co-accused Sudesh Masih was arrested on the spot, where he was allegedly conducting interview and collecting passport from the persons.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that there is no complaint whatsoever, by any person that the petitioner has duped the people in lieu of sending him abroad. He further submits that he has no connection with the office, as alleged in the secret information.

Notice of motion for 15.3.2024.

On the asking of the Court, Ms. Navreet K. Barnala, AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State.

In the meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall, however, join the investigation as and when called for and shall also abide by the conditions specified under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.”

2. On 15.03.2024, the above interim direction issued by this Court, was extended only upto 15 days, with the condition that the petitioner shall re-join the investigation within the stipulated period and fully co-operate with the investigating officer, and in eventuality of non-joining of investigation, it was also observed that the interim direction issued by this Court would be *ipso facto* vacated without further reference to this court.

3. Today, learned State counsel, on instructions imparted to him by SI Premjit Singh, informs this Court that petitioner has not joined investigation despite granting two opportunity.

4. Considering the above circumstances, learned counsel for the petitioner seeks permission of this Court to withdraw the instant petition.

5. **Dismissed as withdrawn.**
