PANKAJ JAIN, J. (ORAL)

On 16.01.2024, the following order was passed :-

“Apprehending his arrest in FIR No.46 dated 27.08.2023, registered for offences punishable under Sections 304 and 34 of IPC (Sections 21 ad 29 of NDPS Act added later on) at Police Station Smalsar, District Moga, the petitioner has preferred this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking pre-arrest bail.

Counsel for the petitioner inter alia submits that the petitioner is alleged to have supplied intoxicating tablets and heroin to main accused Gurpreet Singh and Kiranvir Kaur, who further are stated to have supplied the same to the deceased Manpreet Singh.

Notice of motion for 19.03.2024.

Mr. Tarun Aggarwal, Sr. DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State and on instructions from ASI Satnam Kaur, submits that there

is no other case pending against the petitioner under NDPS Act and has clean antecedents.

In the meantime, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the arresting officer/Investigating Officer. As and when called, the petitioner shall join the investigation. He shall abide by the conditions enumerated under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C. ”

2. Today, Ld. State Counsel on instructions from the police official who is present in Court submits that the petitioner has already joined investigation and is no more required for custodial interrogation.
3. Without commenting on the merits of the case and in view of the aforesaid fact, order dated 16.01.2024 is made absolute, subject to the conditions as enumerated under Sections 438(2) Cr.P.C.
4. This order should not be treated as "blanket" order. It will not be read granting the petitioner indefinite protection from arrest. It shall be confined to the FIR mentioned *ibid* and will not operate in respect of any other incident that involves commission of an offence.
5. This order does not in any manner limit or restrict the rights or duties of the police or investigating agency to investigate into the charges against the petitioner.
6. The petitioner shall be deemed to be in custody for the purpose of Section 27 of the Evidence Act in regard to a discovery of facts made in pursuance of information supplied by the petitioner in case the occasion arises.

7. It will be open to the police or the investigating agency to move this Court for a direction under Section 439(2) Cr.P.C. to arrest the accused, in the event of violation of any term, such as absconding, non-cooperating during investigation, evasion, intimidation or inducement to witnesses with a view to influence outcome of the investigation or trial.
8. Petition stands disposed off accordingly.
9. Pending applications, if any, also stand disposed of.
