SUDEEPTI SHARMA, J. (Oral)

1. The present petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for issuance of directions to the learned trial Court to conclude the trial of the case titled as “State of Punjab versus Amit Arora and others” within a specific time period.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the case is being adjourned by the learned trial Court solely on the request of the complainant, as such, direction be issued to the learned trial Court to decide the case in time bound period.
3. I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the record.
4. A perusal of the interlocutory orders which have been annexed with the present petition shows that the learned trial Court is making every endeavour to conclude the trial but the adjournments are prayed for by the parties.

5. Notice of motion.

Ms. Kanica Sachdeva, learned AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the State and submits, on instructions from ASI Surjit Singh, that the brother of the petitioner has been declared as “proclaimed person”. She further submits that out of the total 7 cited prosecution witnesses, 4 have already been examined and case is at the fag end.
7. In view of the totality of the facts and circumstances of the case, since the learned trial Court is making every endeavour to conclude the trial expeditiously, therefore, this Court do not find any merit in the present petition and the same is hereby dismissed.
