1. The petitioner has filed the instant petition under Section 439 of the Cr.P.C. with a prayer to grant regular bail to him in case FIR No.30 dated 30.03.2021 registered under Sections 22(c) of NDPS Act, 1985, at Police Station Dialpura, District Bathinda.

2. As per case of the prosecution, the petitioner was apprehended on suspicion by a police party and the polythene recovered from him was searched, which led to the recovery of 100 strips of Rado1-100 bearing batch No.3040121 containing 10 tablets each i.e. 1000 tablets and 150 strips of Celcidal-100 SR containing 10 tablets each i.e. total 1500 tablets having batch No. GT2102057 was effected. As per the report of Regional Testing Forensic Science Laboratory, Bathinda, Tramadol Hydrochloride salt was found in the sample parcel and the total quantity of contraband recovered from the present petitioner turned out to be 334.62 mg Tramadol Hydrochloride. Even the same salt i.e.

Tramadol Hydrochloride was found in other sample and the total quantity of the contraband was 440.520 gm Tramadol Hydrochloride. Even the total recovery effected from the petitioner falls within the ambit of “commercial quantity”.

3. Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Jaswinder Singh, submits that all the prosecution witnesses have been examined in the present case and the trial is at the fag end.

4. In view of the above discussion, no ground is made out for allowing the bail petition and the same is ordered to be dismissed.
