Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner was brutally attacked by respondents No. 4 to 8 and to this effect complaint dated 08.11.2023 (Annexures P-4) was lodged by the petitioner with respondent No.2 but police authorities failed to take any action against the said private respondents and being aggrieved, the petitioner has filed the present petition.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Jaspal Singh Guru, A.A.G., Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondents No. 1 to 3 and on instructions from ASI Gurmeet Singh Submits that FIR No. 14 dated 23.01.2024 under Sections 323, 341, 506, 148, 149 and 201 IPC, Police Station Jamalpur, District Ludhiana against the other party and cross case having DDR 35 dated 31.01.2024 under Sections 323, 341, 427 and 506 IPC is also registered against the present petitioner in the same very Police Station.

Learned State counsel further apprises the Court that in

aforesaid FIR No. 14 dated 23.01.2024 under Sections 323, 341, 506, 148, 149 and 201 IPC, Police Station Jamalpur, District Ludhiana, wherein petitioner is complainant, all the six accused are arrested and challan is ready for its presentation before the Court concerned.

Faced with this situation, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that even now the private respondents are extending threats to the petitioner to cause physical harm to him in future.

In light of the above, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the present petition is hereby disposed with the direction to respondent No. 2 to look into the matter and in case there is any threat perception then to provide necessary protection to the petitioner in accordance with law. However, in case the petitioner has committed any offence then law will take its own course.
