JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to re-issue him passport.
2. The petitioner for the first time was issued passport on 18.01.1991 and thereafter passport was re-issued. On account of loss of passport at one occasion, he was issued Emergency Certificate to travel to India. The petitioner vide application dated 23.12.2021 (Annexure P-4) has applied for re-issuance of passport. The said application is still pending.
3. Notice of motion.
4. Ms. Gurneet Sagoo, Central Govt. Counsel and Mr. Inderpreet Singh Kang, AAG, Punjab, who on advance notice are present in Court,

accept notice on behalf of Union of India-respondent Nos.1 & 2 and State-respondent Nos.3 and 4, respectively.

5. With the consent of all parties, the captioned petition is taken up for disposal today itself.

6. Learned counsel for the respondent-Union of India submits that information from concerned quarter has already been received and as per her instructions, application of the petitioner would be disposed of in accordance with law within four weeks from today.

7. In the wake of statement of learned counsel for respondent-Union of India, the present petition stands disposed of. The petitioner is at liberty to move an appropriate application in terms of Article 215 of the Constitution of India, if the respondent fails to comply with its statement.
