NAMIT KUMAR, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioners have filed the instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ of certiorari, quashing the impugned letter dated 05.01.2022 (Annexure P-10), whereby the respondents have asked the Outsourcing Agency to provide the staff/manpower under different categories without taking into consideration the claim of the petitioners for regularization. Further seeking a writ of mandamus, directing the respondents to consider the claim of the petitioners for regularization and not to appoint any other person through any mode till the petitioners are regularized from the due date.

2. On 16.11.2022, the following order was passed :-

“Learned counsel for the respondents seeks time to get necessary instructions, however, states that any process initiated for filling up posts through outsourcing agency would not affect the petitioners herein and they shall not be terminated on that account.



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*Adjourned to 31.03.2023.
In the meantime, pleading be completed.
A photocopy of this order be placed on the files of
other connected cases.”*

3. In view of the statement given by learned counsel for the respondents as recorded in the above order no further orders are required to be passed in the present petition.
4. With regard to the claim of the petitioners for regularization, learned counsel for the respondents submits that the cases of the petitioners for regularization in terms of policy dated 16.05.2023 are under process and shall be finalized within a period of 03 months. He further submits that if the petitioners are found entitled under the said policy, their services shall be regularized.
5. In view of the statement made by learned counsel for the respondents, no further directions are required to be issued in the instant petition and the same is disposed of accordingly at this stage.
6. However, it is made clear that in case the petitioners are found entitled for regularization, the necessary benefits shall be released to them within a period of 02 months from the date of finalization of their claim.
7. Pending application, if any, shall stands disposed of accordingly
