1. The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 482 of Cr.P.C. seeking issuance of directions to respondent Nos. 2 and 3 to take appropriate legal action against respondent No. 4 after registering an FIR under the appropriate sections.
2. At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner has filed a representation on 12.10.2023 (*Annexure P-4*) before respondent No. 2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Moga raising her grievances as raised in the present petition but the same has not yet been considered and no action has been taken thereon. He further submitted that at this stage, the petitioner would feel satisfied if appropriate

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directions are issued to respondent No. 2 to decide the aforesaid representation filed by the petitioner and take necessary action thereon.

4. Learned State counsel has submitted that the needful will be done in due course. Let a complete set of the paperbook be supplied to her during the course of the day.

5. In view of the limited prayer made by the petitioner, without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of at this stage with a direction to respondent No. 2 to decide the aforesaid representation of the petitioner within a period of two months from today, by passing a speaking order in accordance with law and take necessary action, if so required.
