1. The instant petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking directions to respondent Nos. 2 and 3 to look into the representation/complaint dated 01.08.2018 (Annexure P-4) and take action on the same in accordance with law and register a criminal case against the private respondents.

2. Upon notice, status report has been filed by the respondent-State. On a perusal of the same, it is revealed that the petitioner had given a complaint on 07.10.2015 to the Commissioner of Police, Jalandhar against the private respondent to the effect that they had tried to take illegal possession of her plot. Another complaint was received by one Narinderpal on 01.10.2015 against the present petitioner and some other persons with the allegations that the petitioner had sold the said plot, which was finally purchased by the mother of Narinderpal in the year 2006 and the civil Court had granted a decree in favour of the petitioner, on the basis of which, the petitioner had got

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registered the said plot in her name. Hence, she had committed cheating with the mother of Narinderpal. Both the complaints were inquired into and it was found that the petitioner, in connivance with Gurwinder Singh, Harwinder Singh, Puran Singh, Kuldeep Singh, Lachman Singh and her son Baljeet Singh, had got prepared some documents, on the basis of which, she had got registered the said plot in her name on 08.08.2008. Consequently, an FIR bearing No. 223 dated 25.07.2016, under Sections 420, 465, 468, 471, 447, 511 and 120-B of IPC had been registered against the petitioner and others at Police Station Navi Baradari, Jalandhar. After completion of necessary investigation and usual formalities, *challan* under Section 173 of Cr.P.C. was presented in the Court and presently, the trial is going on.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner could not dispute the aforesaid facts.
4. In view of the above, the present petition is dismissed being devoid of any merit. The petitioner will be at liberty to avail her alternative remedy in accordance with law, if so advised.
