1. Present revision petition has been filed under Article 227 of the Constitution of India for quashing the impugned order dated 14.12.2015 passed by the Additional Civil Judge (Sr. Division), Malerkotla (Annexure P-3), vide which the application filed by the present petitioner under Order 21 Rule 32 CPC has been dismissed and the impugned order dated 20.01.2017 (Annexure P-5) vide which the appeal filed by the present petitioner against the said order has been dismissed.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner as well as for the respondent, after seeking specific instructions from their respective



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clients, have jointly submitted that the petitioner and the respondent had decided to part ways and they reiterate the fact that they wish to part-ways and seek divorce by filing a joint petition. It is jointly submitted that the petitioner and the respondent had earlier filed a joint petition dated 02.04.2024 before this Court, which has been placed on record of the file of the present case. It is also jointly submitted that both the parties undertake to be bound by the terms and conditions which have been mentioned in the said joint petition filed under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act and have jointly submitted that the petitioner and the respondent be permitted to file a joint petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act before the concerned Court, as expeditiously as possible.

3. Keeping in view the above-said facts and circumstances, the present revision petition is disposed of in terms of the joint statement made before this Court and the petitioner as well as the respondent are permitted to file a joint petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, before the concerned Court, in accordance with law and both the parties would be bound by the statement made by them before this Court.
