The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking writ in the nature of *mandamus* directing Respondent No.1 to consider and appoint him as Resident Medical Officer in cantonment Board, Amrtisar, as a result of his selection in pursuance to the advertisement and interview held on 09.06.2000.

At the outset, learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that despite her best efforts, she has not been able to contact the petitioner and, therefore, she is not having any further instructions in the matter.

In this view of the matter, the instant petition is hereby dismissed for non-prosecution with liberty to the petitioner to seek revival of the present petition, in case any cause, still survives.
