1. The petitioner has filed the instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India with the grievance that against the punishment order dated 03.10.2023 (Annexure P-1), the petitioner has preferred statutory appeal dated 16.11.2023 (Annexure P-2) and the authorities are bent upon effecting recovery.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner at the outset prays for deciding the appeal dated 16.11.2023 (Annexure P-2) filed by the petitioner expeditiously by passing a speaking order within a time bound frame.
3. Notice of motion.
4. Mr. T.S. Sidhu, Advocate, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and submits that the appeal filed by the petitioner shall be decided expeditiously.
5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have gone through the record of the case.

The appellate authority-respondent No.2 is directed to consider and decide the appeal dated 16.11.2023 (Annexure P-2) in accordance with law, by passing a speaking order as expeditiously as possible preferably within a period of six months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
7. Since the statutory appeal is still pending and yet to be decided, it will be in the interest of justice that no further recovery be effected from the petitioner till the disposal of the appeal.
8. The petition stands disposed of in the above terms.
