The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure with a prayer to issue appropriate directions to the respondents No.2 to 5 not to harass the petitioner and his colleagues by calling them during an inquiry of compliant No.3429/PP dated 14.12.2022 submitted by respondent No.6. A further prayer has been made to investigate the case in FIR No.327 dated 24.12.2022 registered under Sections 452, 323, 324, 427, 506, 148 and 149 of IPC, 1860 at Police Station Cantonment Amritsar fairly and impartially.
2. A short reply by way of an affidavit of the Assistant Commissioner of Police, West Amritsar City (additional charge) has been filed on behalf of the respondent No.3-State.
3. Learned State counsel submits that a Compliant No.3429/PP dated 14.12.2022 has been submitted by respondent No.6 and an inquiry has already been conducted by Police Station Economic Offence Wing, Punjab

and the said matter has been closed by the police on 29.12.2023. He further submits that the investigation arising out of the FIR No.327 dated 24.12.2022 registered under Sections 452, 323, 324, 427, 506, 148 and 149 of IPC, 1860 at Police Station Cantonment Amritsar is pending with ASP West, Amritsar and the investigation shall be concluded within a period of three months from today, after associating both the sides.

4. In view of the statement made by the learned State counsel, no further directions are required and the present petition is accordingly disposed off.
