1. The petitioner is seeking the concession of interim-regular bail in case bearing FIR No.82 dated 01.04.2021 under Sections 21C/61/85 of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 and Section 25/54/59 of Arms Act, Sub Section 6, 7 & 8 of Arms Act at Police Station Maqboolpura, Amritsar on the ground that his wife is suffering from kidney problem.

2. Learned State counsel, in compliance of order dated 01.02.2024, has filed status report by way of affidavit of Gurinderbir Singh PPS, ACP East Amritsar today in the Court, which is taken on record subject to all just exceptions and a copy thereof supplied to learned counsel opposite. A perusal of Annexure R-3, which is true typed copy of some medical certificate issued by one Drishti Hospital,

Ekta Nagar, Kumharoan Wala Mohalla, Near Tava Ban, Chhota Haripura, Amritsar, raises a big question mark about its authenticity. The wife of the petitioner is stated to be a terminal case of renal failure; however, the doctor i.e. Dr.Prithvi Bhardwaj, who is stated to be treating the petitioner’s wife, is neither a nephrologist nor even a General Medical Practitioner. He is BAMS in Child Health.

- 3. In the circumstances, this Court would not be inclined to extend the concession of interim-regular bail to the petitioner.
- 4. Dismissed.
