JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J (ORAL)

1. The petitioner through the instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking setting aside of order dated 01.09.2022 (Annexure P-3) whereby request of the petitioner for re-issuance of passport has been rejected.
2. The petitioner for the same grievance and against the same order, preferred CWP No. 26237 of 2022 before this Court (Annexure P-9) which came to be disposed of vide order dated 17.11.2022, with liberty to petitioner to apply for emergency certificate. However, the petitioner did not opt to apply for emergency certificate.
3. The petitioner has filed second petition for the same grievance and against the same order. It is settled law that the principle of res judicata is also applicable to writ jurisdiction, thus, petition is barred by said principle.
4. The petition stands dismissed being not maintainable.
