SURESHWAR THAKUR, J. (Oral)

1. In the instant petition cast under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India read with Section 3(1)(c) and 3(1)(d) of the Haryana Good Conduct Prisoners (Temporary Release) Act, 1988, the convict-petitioner prays for quashing of the order dated 18.01.2024 (Annexure P-2) passed by respondent No. 5, whereby the latter has declined the grant of parole to the convict-petitioner.

2. Further, the convict-petitioner has prayed for a relief qua his being released on emergency parole for a period of ten weeks, on the ground for arranging school fee of his son.

3. In the facts and circumstances, without quashing the impugned order (Annexure P-2), thus the convict/petitioner is granted parole under police escort for a period of three weeks. The Superintendent of the jail concerned, is directed to deploy two armed guards in plain clothes alongwith the convict-petitioner, who shall

accompany him during the said period of his parole.

4. Furthermore, the armed guards shall ensure that the convict-petitioner is retrieved to the prison concerned, on completion of the afore period of parole.

5. All the expenses towards the transportation of the convict-petitioner besides qua the accompanying him armed guards shall be borne by the convict-petitioner. In addition, the expenses towards the boarding and lodging of the armed guards shall also be borne by the convict-petitioner.

6. Since the State of Haryana is a welfare State, therefore, it is expected that only minimal expenses shall be charged from the applicant both towards the transportation expenses of the armed guards besides towards the boarding and lodging of the said deployed armed guards with him.

7. The petition stands disposed of accordingly.
