NAMIT KUMAR, J. (ORAL)

1. This petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of writ of *mandamus* directing the respondents to implement further the amended revised pay scales effective from 01.01.1986 in accordance with the Punjab Civil Services (Revised) Pay 3rd Amendment Rules, 1990 as notified by the Punjab Government on 15.06.1990 (Annexure P-1) and pay the same to the petitioners along with interest @ 18% per annum and not to reallocate the petitioners in other Corporations or departments till the abovesaid benefit is granted to them.



2. Affidavit of Surinder Pal Singh son of Sardar Amar Singh, General Manager, Punjab State Hosiery and Knitwear Development Corporation Ltd., has been filed in Court today, which is taken on record and copy thereof has been supplied to counsel for the petitioners. In the said affidavit it has been stated as under: -

- “1. That the petitioners have filed the present writ petition inter-alia seeking the issuance of writ of mandamus directing the respondents to amend the revised pay scales and to pay the same to the petitioners.
- 2. That during the pendency of the present petition, all the petitioners have since been retrenched from their service on account of the heavy losses faced by the Punjab State Hosiery and Knitwear Development Corporation Limited. Petitioners have all been paid their retrenchment compensation and other dues.
- 3. That due to the heavy losses, the Punjab State Hosiery and Knitwear Development Corporation Ltd. is in the process of winding up. There are no assets left with the Punjab State Hosiery and Knitwear Development Corporation Limited. Only a skeleton staff of 4 temporary employees is currently employed by the Corporation, who are completing the winding up process.”

3. In view of the stand taken by the respondents in the abovesaid affidavit, nothing survives in the present petition and the same is disposed of accordingly.
