1. The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C with a prayer for extension of time of interim bail granted to the petitioner vide the order Annexure P-4, so as to enable the petitioner to take care of her newly born child.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been falsely involved in case FIR No. 463 dated 29.06.2023, under Sections 302, 34 of IPC, registered at Police Station City Narnaul, District Mahendergarh. He further contends that the petitioner was arrested in the present case on 29.06.2023, however, vide the order Annexure P-2, the petitioner was granted the concession of interim bail for a period of three months i.e. with effect from 05.09.2023 to 05.12.2023. In the meantime, the petitioner gave birth to a male child on 05.10.2023. He further contends that the interim bail granted to the petitioner was further extended by the Court of

Sessions Judge, Narnaul vide the order dated 06.12.2023 and the petitioner was directed to surrender on 06.01.2024. The petitioner again prayed for extension of time and was granted interim bail up to 06.02.2024. Learned counsel further contends that in fact, the newly born baby master Kalpit, aged about 04 months is not maintaining good health and he is suffering from fever and other medical problems, due to cold weather. Learned counsel further submits that the interim bail granted to the petitioner vide Annexure P-4 may be ordered to be extended by this Court.

3. In pursuance to the notice issued by this Court, learned State counsel submits that the local police has verified the facts and it has been found that the newly born infant master Kalpit is not maintaining good health and is suffering from fever and other medical problems.

4. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record.

5. Keeping in view the medical condition of newly born baby, the interim bail granted to the petitioner is extended till 31.03.2024 subject to her furnishing necessary surety bonds/bail bonds to the satisfaction of the concerned Trial Court/Duty Magistrate/CJM. The petitioner is directed to surrender before the Trial Court/jail authorities at 10:00 AM on 01.04.2024.

6. It is made clear that no further extension of time shall be granted under any circumstances.

7. The petition stands disposed off.
