RAJBIR SEHRAWAT, J. (ORAL)

This is a contempt petition filed under Section 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act read with Article 215 of the Constitution of India for initiating contempt proceedings against the respondent for disobedience of the order dated 31.07.2019 passed in CWP-1003-2003.

Learned counsel for the respondent has submitted that pursuant to award passed by the Labour Court, the petitioner had been reinstated into service and has even now retired from the service. Not only that, even the back-wages have been paid to the petitioner. Therefore, there is no contempt qua the order involved in the case.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the petitioner has disputed the assertions made by learned counsel for the respondent and has submitted that some benefits to which the petitioner was entitled, have not been released by the respondent.

In view of the submissions made by learned counsel for the respondent, this Court does not find any ground to continue with the present petition any more. Hence, the same is dismissed.

However, if any specific and defined benefit to which the petitioner considers himself to be entitled is left un-addressed, he would be at liberty to avail any other alternate remedy, but in accordance with law.

The pending miscellaneous application, if any, is also disposed of as such.
