KULDEEP TIWARI. J.(Oral)

1. The instant petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of directions to the official respondents to protect the lives and liberty of the petitioners and to restrain the private respondents not to harass or interfere in their peaceful married life.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that both the petitioners are major and this is their first marriage. Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that both the petitioners are married. The date of birth of petitioner no. 1 is 25.03.2002 and thus she has completed 21 years of age and petitioner no. 2 was born in the year 1994 and thus, he is now 30 years of age. To substantiate this submission, learned counsel for the petitioners placed reliance upon copies of Aadhar Cards attached with the petition as Annexures P/1 and P/2. He further submits that both the petitioners have solemnized marriage against the wishes of private respondents on 07.02.2024, and now they are apprehending threat to their

lives and liberty at the hands of private respondents. He further submits that the petitioners have submitted a representation dated 08.02.2024, (Annexure P/4) to the official respondents but no action has been taken on the same.

3. Notice of motion.
4. On asking of the Court, Mr. Akshay Kumar, AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondents no. 1 to 3.
5. In view of the above, without examining the question of legality and validity of the marriage and expressing any opinion thereon, the petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent no.2 – Senior Superintendent of Police, Mansa to look into the representation dated 08.02.2024 (Annexure P/4) qua threat perception and if there is any substance in it, to take necessary steps in accordance with law, to ensure that the lives and liberty of the petitioners are not jeopardized at the hands of private respondents.
6. However, this direction will not validate the marriage as claimed by the petitioners and will have no effect on any civil or criminal action, which could be initiated in the matter in accordance with law.
7. Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
