NAMIT KUMAR J. (Oral)

The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ of mandamus, directing the respondents to make the payment of 18% interest to the petitioner on the delayed payment of pension and pensionary benefits.

Learned counsel for the respondents has produced copy of the death certificate of the petitioner, who unfortunately died on 14.11.2014, however, even after a lapse of about 10 years, no legal representatives of the petitioner have been brought on record.

In this view of the matter, the present petition is dismissed for non-prosecution.

However liberty is granted to legal representatives of petitioner to revive the present petition in case any cause still survives.
