NAMIT KUMAR, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner has filed the instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for claiming the following reliefs :-

“(1) Issue a writ in the nature of certiorari quashing the policy made applicable with effect from 08.08.1984 and continued upto to 01.05.1988 (second policy).

(2) Issue a further writ of Certiorari quashing the order No.795 dated 30.06.1997 appended as annexure P/7 qua private respondents only:

(3) issue a further writ of Mandamus directing the official respondents to promote the petitioners on the post of Secretary, Market Committee in the State of Punjab on 43 vacancies which had accrued w.e.f. 08.04.1984 to 01.05.1988 or alternatively in case second policy is found to be in order and promotion of the private respondents



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vide order dated 30.6.1997 found to be good then promote the petitioners against the remaining 19 unfilled vacancies which accrued from 08.04.1984 to 01.05.1988 with all consequential benefits.”

2. Learned counsel for respondents No.1 & 2 submits that during the pendency of the present petition, the petitioner has retired from service on attaining the age of superannuation on 31.05.2001 as Superintendent Grade-II and all his retiral dues have been released to him. She further submits that even the private respondents have also retired from service on attaining the age of their superannuation and the instant petition has been rendered infructuous.
3. The abovesaid facts have not been disputed by learned counsel for the petitioner.
4. Disposed of as having become infructuous.
5. Pending application, if any, shall stands disposed of accordingly
