1. The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking writ in the nature of *certiorari* for quashing the orders Annexures P-8, P-9 and P-11 passed by the respondent-Corporation and further a writ of prohibition has been sought restraining the respondents from proceeding further with the inquiry proceedings in pursuance to the memorandum dated 09.01.1996 (Annexure P-2)

2. At the outset, learned senior counsel appearing for the respondent-Corporation submits that after filing of the instant petition, the services of the petitioner were terminated in the year, 2011 and thereafter, the petitioner preferred to challenge the order of his termination, by raising an industrial dispute before the Labour Court, and the said reference has been answered in negative, vide award dated 02.02.2023, passed by the learned Presiding Officer, Industrial Tribunal, Bathinda, and the said award has never been impugned by the petitioner any further, therefore, in view of these subsequent developments, the relief claimed in the instant petition has become infructuous.

3. Accordingly, the present petition is disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous.

4. All pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
